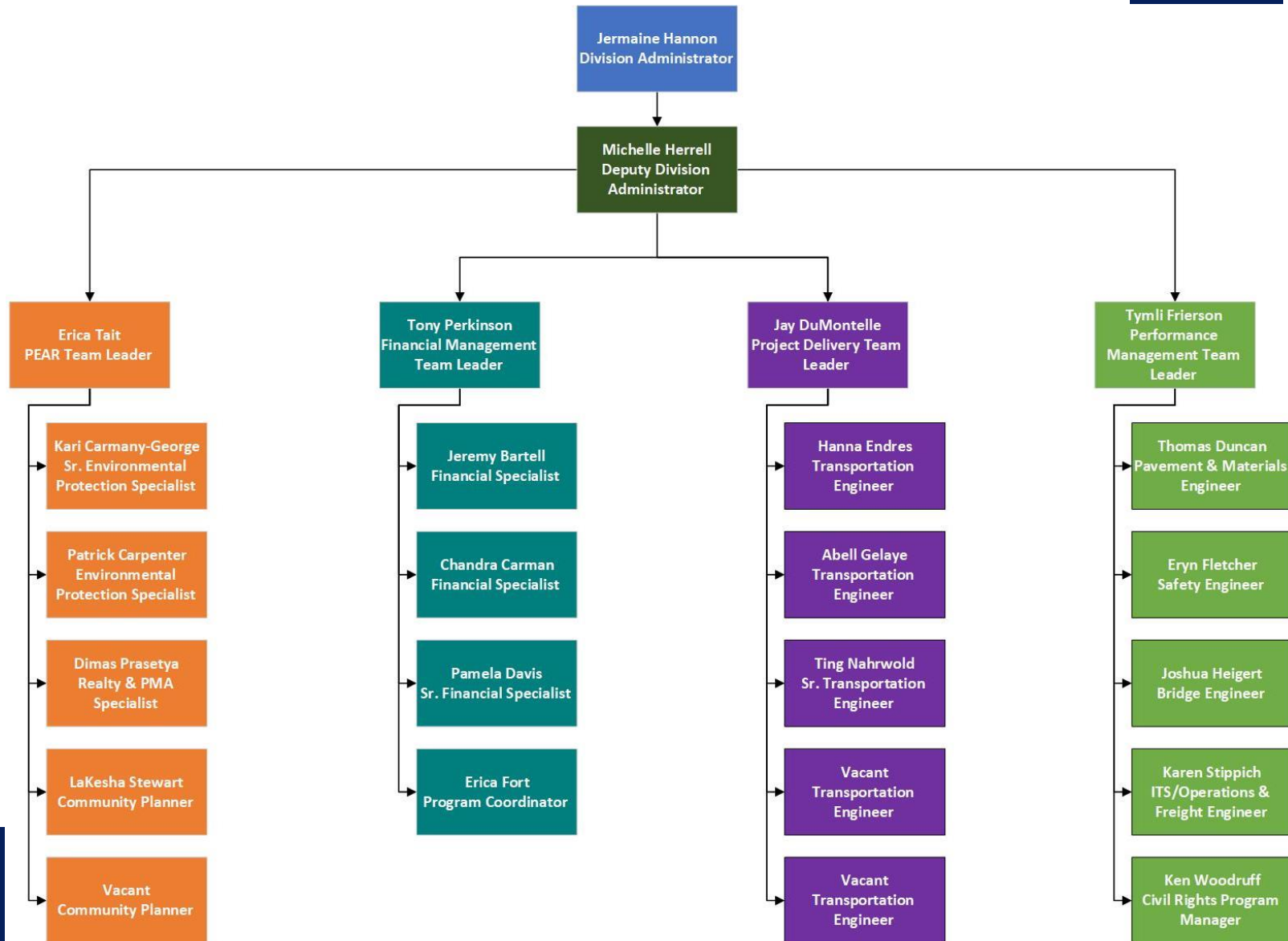

Bipartisan Infrastructure Law

- Signed in late 2021 – provides \$550B from 2022-2026
- \$350B investment in highway programs, which is administered by FHWA
- More than a dozen new formula and discretionary grant programs
- Builds upon Preservation from MAP-21 and FAST Act
